Interactive presentations designed for a wide public where participants can observe the crafting techniques and uses of ancient technologies by demonstrations and handling.



Fibers: cordage and weaving

- Demonstrations: treating plant fibers, making rope, finger weaving.
- Objects: plant fibers, bark beater, ropes, tumpline.

Bone work: sewing and tanning (Prehistory)

- Demonstrations: bone working, scraping hide, sewing leather.
- Objects: stone tools, deer bones, raw hide, leather, bone objects.



Wood work: carving and bark (19th century)

- Demonstrations: carving wood, assembling bark, making a pin toy.
- Objects: materials, crooked knife, adze, awl, wood and bark objects.

Stone work: knapping and polishing (Prehistory to 19th century)

- Demonstrations: glass knapping, stone pecking and polishing.
- Objects: projectile points, axe, adze, percussion and polishing tools.



Fishing techniques: lines and nets

- Demonstrations: making rope, bone fish hooks, stone sinkers and nets.
- Objects: plants fibers, fishing lines, hooks, harpoons, nets, stone tools.

Hunting techniques: spear throwers and bows

- Demonstrations: making a bow and arrow.
- Objects: stone, bone and antler tools, spear, spear thrower, bow, arrow.
