Conference with hands-on activity.

Duration 60 min / max 30 participants. Fee 75.00\$

Interactive presentation where participants can handle materials and reproductions of objects that were once used in the daily life of aboriginal communities.

Choice of subjects:

- Aboriginal peoples in Quebec: history and lifeways.
- Fibers: ordinary plants and extraordinary uses.
- Bone work in the prehistoric period: doing much with little.
- Wood work in the historic period: traditions and innovations.

Conference with work demonstration.

Duration 90 min / max 30 participants. Fee 100.00\$

Interactive presentation where participants can handle reproductions of artifacts and observe traditional crafting techniques.

Choice of subjects:

- Plant fibers: the secret of weeds. Making a tumpline.
- Deer bones: a forgotten treasure. Making a tool.
- Birch wood: a material to redicover. Making a pin toy.
- Fishing techniques: from line to net. Making a net.
- Hunting techniques: from spear thrower to bow. Making a bow.

Conference with craft workshop.

Interactive presentation where participants can experiment making a traditional object with the craftsman. Material included.

- Plant fiber string
- Bone needle
- Thorn fish hook
- Leaf doll
- Dream catcher
